The High Priest, Jesus Christ, will take care of the rest.





Cathedral Basilica of Saint Louis, Missouri



This basilica is the mother church of the Archdiocese of St. Louis in Missouri. Construction on the magnificent structure was begun in 1907, and the church was dedicated in 1914 but was not consecrated until its full completion in 1926.

It is of a brilliant Romanesque style, and its primary distinguishing mark is that it is almost entirely decorated by mosaics, the largest single collection in the Western Hemisphere and the largest mosaic collection in the world outside of Russia. A number of the mosaics in

the side chapels and sanctuary were crafted by Louis Comfort Tiffany himself.

The mosaics collectively contain 41.5 million glass pieces in more than 7,000 colors. Covering 83,000 square feet, which may make it evident why the installation of mosaics began in 1912 but was not completed until 1988!

Three former Cardinals of St. Louis – John J. Glennon, Joseph Ritter, and John Carberry are buried in the Basilica's crypt, as well as Archbishop John L. May.
